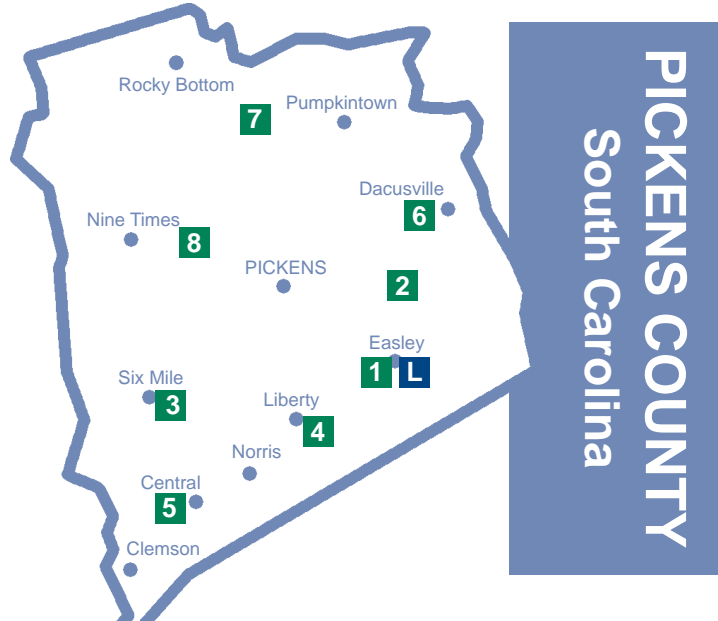
**PICKENS COUNTY RECYCLING STATIONS** are for residential use only. There is no charge to use the stations. Businesses **MUST** use the Pickens County Construction and Demolition Debris (C&D) Landfill.

## THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE NOT ACCEPTED AT PICKENS COUNTY RECYCLING STATIONS

- **Pesticides, brake fluid and chemicals of any kind** – For disposal information, call the S.C. Department of Health and Environmental Control at (864) 241-1090.
- **Dead animals** – Small animals (dogs and cats) may be taken in plastic bags to the landfill. There is no charge for disposal.
- **Large loads of brush** (more than one wheelbarrow load) should be taken to the landfill. There is no charge for disposal.
- **Shingles** (more than one wheelbarrow load) must be taken to the landfill. There is a charge of \$20 per ton for disposal.
- **Partially burned trash** is not accepted at recycling centers or the landfill. It is illegal to burn trash in South Carolina. Ask for a brochure at either location.
- **Large tires** from trucks or large tractors must be taken to the landfill. There is a charge of \$80 per ton for disposal.
- **Cross ties and creosote-treated lumber** must be taken to the landfill. There is a charge of \$36 per ton for disposal.
- **Asbestos** is not accepted in any form. For disposal information, call the Solid Waste Department at (864) 859-3492.

<b>ALUMINUM AND STEEL CANS</b>	Aluminum beverage and steel "tin" food cans, aerosol cans, scrap aluminum	Rinse . Labels do not need to be removed. Foil and pie pans ARE NOT accepted.	Recycling Stations
<b>APPLIANCES (WHITE GOODS) AND SCRAP METAL</b>	All appliances with metal parts (stoves, washers and dryers, refrigerators, grills and bicycles, etc.)	See details under "More to Know."	Recycling Stations and Landfill
<b>BATTERIES, LEAD-ACID</b>	Used automotive, marine and lawn mower batteries	Flashlight batteries are accepted for disposal.	Recycling Stations
<b>BROWN GOODS</b>	Furniture, mattresses, box springs, sofas, wooden swing sets, etc.		Recycling Stations
<b>CARDBOARD, PASTEBOARD AND PAPER BAGS</b>	Corrugated cardboard (no wax finish) used for packing and shipping	Flatten. Brown paper grocery bags can be recycled with cardboard.	Recycling Stations and the Bailing Facility
<b>CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION DEBRIS (C&amp;D)</b>	See list of items under "More to Know."	Shingles are accepted in small amounts (one wheelbarrow load or less). Larger amounts must go to the landfill (disposal fee is \$20 per ton). C&D and all other disposal is \$35 per ton.	Recycling Stations and Landfill
<b>GLASS</b>	Clear, green, brown and blue glass bottles and jars	Remove caps and lids. Rinse. Window glass, pottery, porcelain and china are accepted for disposal.	Recycling Stations
<b>NEWSPAPER, MAGAZINES AND OTHER PAPER</b>	Dry newspapers, inserts, telephone books, unwanted mail, catalogs, paper egg cartons, paperback books, gift paper, magazines (Newspaper carriers may bring extra papers to the Bailing Facility at no cost.*)	Do not tie or bag newspapers. Carbon paper or partially burned paper IS NOT accepted. Covers from hardback books should be removed; inside pages may be recycled.	Recycling Stations  *The Bailing Facility is located at the Pickens County Landfill.
<b>USED MOTOR OIL, OIL BOTTLES AND OIL FILTERS</b>	Used motor oil, filters and bottles (oil must be free of gasoline or diesel fuel) and other petroleum products (see list on the right)	Limit five gallons per trip. See list of items not accepted under "More to Know."	Recycling Stations
<b>PLASTIC</b>	Soft drink and plastic bottles marked by a recycling symbol with a number 1-7 (usually found on the bottom), milk jugs, plastic grocery bags	Plastic flower pots and styrofoam (although they may have a recycling symbol) ARE NOT accepted.	Recycling Stations
<b>TIRES</b>	Passenger vehicle tires accepted at Recycling Stations; large truck and tractor tires MUST be taken to the landfill.	Limit four tires per day at Recycling Stations. More information is available under "More to Know."	Recycling Stations and Landfill

## More to Know...

- **ANTIFREEZE** is accepted at Pickens County Recycling Stations. Antifreeze receptacles are provided at each station. DO NOT put antifreeze in the used motor oil collection tanks.
- **APPLIANCES AND SCRAP METALS:** Enclosed cylinders with valves are accepted. Barrels must be cut in half or have one end removed.
- All good **CLOTHING** (including belts, shoes and hats) can be taken to Pickens County Recycling Stations.
- **COOKING OIL (HOUSEHOLDS ONLY)** is accepted at the Easley Recycling Station. Please limit five gallons per visit.
- **CONSTRUCTION AND DEMOLITION DEBRIS:** Items accepted include floor covering, carpet, vinyl siding, plastic covering from building material, brick, block, sheet rock, plaster, plasterboard, PVC pipe, poly-fiberglass (tubs, showers and roofing material), glass (windows and doors), hardened concrete and cement, lumber, insulation, wall and ceiling tiles, paneling, wall paper and mirrors.
- **PAINT:** Drop off usable paint or pick up paint to use. Cans with rusted lids and cans less than half full WILL NOT be accepted. To dispose of unusable paint, mix sand, dirt or cat litter and let dry. Then pour mixture into a trash bag for disposal. Allow cans to dry and deposit them in the scrap metal container.
- **USED MOTOR OIL, FILTERS AND BOTTLES:** The following petroleum products ARE ACCEPTED and may be put into the used oil collection tank: motor oil, hydraulic fluid, gear oil, diesel fuel, fuel oil, kerosene, automatic transmission fluid and power steering fluid. The following petroleum products ARE NOT ACCEPTED at Pickens County Recycling Stations – gasoline, varsol, gasoline/oil mixtures, brake fluid, paint thinner, refrigeration oil and any solvent cleaner or substance used to clean paint brushes. Farmers may bring oil from farm machinery (up to 55 gallons) to the Easley Recycling Station as well.
- **TIRES:** Large tires must be taken to the landfill; a fee of \$80 per ton will be charged to dispose large tires. Rims do not have to be removed.
- **YARD DEBRIS** is accepted at Recycling Stations in small amounts only (a wheelbarrow load or less). Larger amounts must be taken to the Landfill and can be disposed at no charge. On **SATURDAYS ONLY**, large amounts of yard debris will be accepted at the Easley Recycling Station.
